Employing Specialist teachers or qualified coaches to work alongside teachers in lessons to increase their subject knowledge and confidence in PE	Year 6 teachers worked alongside a Level 2 gym coach for the gym unit 'Holes and Obstacles' (Spring Term 2014) became more confident in teaching gym  <b>Cost: Included in CSSP membership</b>
Providing cover staff to release teachers for professional development in PE and Sport	PE coordinator attended the CSSP Network Meeting (Spring Term 2014) to maintain an up-to-date knowledge and understanding of high quality PE. This improved subject coordinator monitoring as well as the delivery of high quality PE in our school. PE coordinator was released to attend inter-school competition, allowing for an increase in competitive participation. 82% of children in y1-y6 participated in inter-school competition. Children represented the school in inter-school competition in athletics, football, Rounders, hockey, netball and cross country.  <b>Cost: £400</b>
Paying staff (TA's) to run/support the running of clubs and competitions	Increased adult support enabled more clubs to run and therefore increased pupil participation, supporting pupils of all abilities. 57% of children were engaged in extracurricular sporting activity every week. Teaching assistants led or supported the following clubs: Girls Football, y3/4 football, KS1 football, netball, hockey, golf, basketball, multi-skills, gym and running.  <b>Cost: £1800</b>
